

## Class 5 Curriculum Spring Term 2008

- Literacy* Work will include persuasive writing: advertisements, leaflets, letters, debates. Poetry: a range of poems comparing and contrasting the writer's techniques. Completing writing tasks in a set length of time (20 mins, 45 mins)  
Year 6 SAT revision.
- Numeracy* Work will include Shape - 2D/3D, Angle, Line and Rotational Symmetry, Data Handling, Ratio and Proportion, Problem Solving  
Year 6 SAT revision.
- Science* How we see things.  
Interdependence and Adaptation. - Plants and animals adapting to their food chains, soils.  
Year 6 SAT revision
- Geography* Water. We will study the water supply around the world, importance of clean water and how it is supplied, managing and water conservation.  
(Hopefully a visit to a water treatment works!)
- R.E.* How do people express their faith through the arts? - Focus on the ways music, art and drama are used to express aspects of faith.
- PSHE & C* Respect for Property
- P.E* Children will be developing their sporting skills through movement, country dance and a range of outdoor games, including Tag Rugby, Football and Netball.

- Music* Ongoing skills.  
The children are developing a range of musical skills including using musical terms, notation and pitch.
- ART & DT* People in Action. Explaining how movement is conveyed in art.
- I.C.T.* ICT is used throughout the curriculum to enhance and extend the children's learning.  
Using the internet for research, data handling, manipulation of pictures, text and simulations.
- French* The children are learning common phrases, leading to conversations in a restaurant setting.
